We are delighted that the children of West Park Academy have thought about those people who are homeless in our town and want to do something to show that people care.

Toiletries are a fantastic idea, they are expensive to buy when you are homeless and it can be difficult to carry large bottles about so they often have to abandon them and are left with nothing again. So it is a great choice.

I have set out below the types of items that are very helpful. I have done a list of helpful things for our beneficiaries and a list of helpful items that they can also use in our Day Centre (larger economy bottles etc.). I hope the children have fun pulling this together.

We have approximately 65% male, 35% female at present.

List for our beneficiaries: (small bottles for ease of carrying, **no aerosols**). Shampoo, conditioner, shower gel, soap, tooth paste, toothbrushes, roll on deodorant, roll on perfumes/body sprays.

For the Centre: Large cheap brand bottles/boxes

Shampoo, Conditioner, shower gel, Laundry tablets, dishwasher tablets (due to risk of spreading infections, our cups must be sanitised through a high heat dishwasher, we go through a lot of dishwasher tablets)!

Also if people want to give something other than toiletries, then tea bags, coffee, sugar and cuppa soups are all very gratefully received too as our kettle is on throughout the day.

I hope this gives you something to get your teeth into. We will be so grateful of anything from the list that the children would like to donate and I know our beneficiaries will be very touched by the sentiment, especially coming from the young ones.
