Frida Kahlo 1907-1954

A Mexican painter, who is well known for her portraits, self-portraits and works inspired by





Mexico. She is most famous for paintings such as *The Two Fridas*, *Self Portrait with Thorn Necklace* and Hummingbird.

She had an illness at age 6, which left her disabled. She also suffered a terrible accident aged 18, causing her severe pain for the rest of her life. Her paintings mixed realism and fantasy. She used a naïve folk-art style to explore many ideas.

L.S. Lowry 1887-1976





A British painter born in Manchester, England. He is famous for painting scenes of life in the industrial districts of North West England in the mid-20th century.

He became well known for his match stalk men and the landscapes in the area where he lived.

Yinka Shonibare 1962-present day

A British-Nigerian artist living in the UK. His works explore race, class and cultural identity, and comment on the tangled interrelationship between Africa and Europe, and their economic and political histories.

Paralysed down one side of his body, he relies on a team of assistants to bring his artistic ideas and creations to life.

A trademark of his art is the brightly coloured



Ankara fabric he uses.

Banksy - Some people believe he was born around 1973.

Banksy chooses to keep his identity hidden. He is thought to be from Bristol where his first works appeared. He is a British graffiti artist, best known as a street artist and is considered a modern artist. His work often appears in high visibility places such as on buildings or train stations. His work is done using a stencilling technique.
